
Buy a Water Tank

What is Distinguished Service? As engraved on the beautiful crystal presented to Sue at the District Foundation event: it is outstanding efforts promoting and supporting the many programs of The Rotary Foundation dedicated to peace and understanding. Programs such as Annual Giving, District and Global Grants, Rotary Direct, Training and Education, Donor Recognition, Peace Fellowships and of course, Polio Eradication.

It is also service performed over a long period of time as well as feet-on-the-ground service like Sue jumping into Lake George at the Annual Polio Plunge and crocheting dozens and dozens of red hats to raise funds for polio vaccine.

Highlights of Sue's long service to TRF and our District include District Governor in 2013-2014, PHF and she and Dennis are Major Donors, District Foundation Chair for the past six years, long time member of the District Training Team, has worked on countless Foundation events as well as many other events, visits clubs all over the District, does tons of reporting and paperwork supporting the stewardship of our donations, has the Meritorious Service certificate from TRF and is the 2019-2020 recipient of the George Frost Award. She is past president and secretary of the Schenectady East Rotary Club.

Several Rotarians in District 7190 have been honored with the Distinguished Service Recognition: PDG Olive Scott (Cobleskill), PDG James Spencer (Middleburgh), PDG Anne Cargile (Shenendehowa) and PDG George Frost, now deceased.



Burnt Hills Ballston Lake Rotary Undertakes a Global Grant in Zambia

BHBL Rotary, in partnership with the Kusinta-Lusaka Rotary, Zambia, are working on a Global Grant focused on Maternal and Child Health and Disease Prevention and Treatment. The location of the project is Muchila Center, which is a village in the rural Southern Province of Zambia. In areas such as this as many as 1 in 13 women die from maternal related causes, compared to 1 in 4,000 in developed countries. Families in this area tend to have multiple children, often in rapid succession. Of grave concern is that children two or under who lose their mother are 10 times as likely to die prematurely than those who have not. Additionally, it is estimated that 80% of the population is suffering from oral disease. The majority in rural areas have no access at all to oral health care services.

BHBL Rotary is working closely with an NGO, named the Muchila Access Project (MAP). MAP, in coordination with the village of Muchila, the government regional health district, and local health officials identified the two "Areas of Focus" for this grant. Over the past several years MAP raised over \$100,000 to renovate and expand a building to serve as the Muchila Health Center. The building is now complete. The Muchila Health Center now needs instruments, equipment and supplies to become fully functional. A non-profit, Project C.U.R.E., which The Rotary Foundation (TRF) has worked with on other projects, collects and ships excess and refurbished high-quality medical instruments, equipment and supplies, appropriate for the specific situation, and only charges for shipment and some administrative costs. Our shipment will take up a 40' shipping container. Project C.U.R.E reports that the value of its contents will be between \$350,00 and \$450,000.

On Nov 8 and 9 a doctor and expert representative from Project C.U.R.E., along with representation from Kusinta-Lusaka Rotary, and local Muchila health officials conducted an assessment of the center to identify the exact materials needed.

Once these essential items are shipped and installed through Global Grant funds the Muchila Health Center, which is centrally located in a region populated

by 43,154 people, will become the hub for referrals from, and support for, 17 outlying health posts in seven zones for managing obstetric and neonatal emergencies, expanding services for pre and postnatal care and providing much needed preventative, emergent and essential dental services.

We are hoping others become as enthusiastic as we are and would like to help us in supporting this humanitarian project. In doing so, we collectively will have enhanced the quality of life and longevity for thousands of individuals.

A veteran and Glenville Rotarian, Thomas is using his trip to raise money for service dogs to assist veterans. Thomas' trip started on September 23rd in Scotia, and he will bike back to the Capital region. Weather permitting, Thomas travels approximately 20 miles per day.

Update for Chituka Village Project 2022

-Introduction of coed soccer play days for children in grades 1,2,3, and 4

-Support for schools that have girls and boys, soccer teams, while promoting gender equality

Mexican Wedding Cakes

(aka Russian Teacakes)

"A 'melt in your mouth' Betty
Crocker classic and (another)
longtime family favorite." Barb



1 cup butter or margarine

½ cup sifted confectioners' sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

¼ teaspoon salt

34 cup finely chopped nuts

Mix butter, sugar, and vanilla thoroughly. Measure flour by dipping method or by sifting. Stir flour and salt together, blend in. Mix in nuts. Chill dough.

Heat oven to 400 degrees F. Roll dough into 1" balls. Place on ungreased baking sheet. (Cookies do not spread.) Bake 10 to 12 minutes, or until set but not brown. While still warm, roll in confectioners' sugar. Cool. Roll in sugar again.

Makes about 4 dozen 1" cookies.

(Note: Do not use self-rising flour in this recipe.)
