#### From the Governor's Desk

Happy March Rotary District 7190!

This month I wanted to write you a much more personal address. I know my term is not complete yet, however, I am already taking an accounting of what this Rotary experience has done for me. I am so truly grateful for all of the experiences (mostly positive, some difficult) that I have had throughout this Rotary year.

My overall life experiences thus far have taught me to practice gratitude. To have a healthy balance of celebrating the moment and planning for the future. That said, I am still a growing professional in the second half of my thirties with MUCH to learn and experience.

My experiences with our incredible organization have forever positively impacted my life and my future. All of these experiences were opportunities for me to learn. To learn to be a better person, a better mother to my children and a better employee at Marshall & Sterling. There is also no doubt that Rotary helped me through one of my toughest life experiences. I am forever grateful for the wonderful community that surrounded my girls and I after my divorce. Many club and district members became influential role models in my children's lives and helped me through a very difficult time. Many of my skills acquired through Rotary helped me learn how to run a single parent household more effectively and how to prioritize what was most important financially and at times emotionally.

I was recently selected to organize and lead a breakout session in Singapore this May. The title of the breakout session is "Professional Development: A BIG Membership Benefit." As I have been developing the foundation of this course, I have been organizing all that I have gained and learned from my time in Rotary. Of course, there are the obvious positive by-products and some that are much more subtle which include:

- NETWORKING: Rotary was founded (in part) on the idea of networking. Gathering businessmen together of different vocations to work together to solve a problem. Rotary gave me an open forum to learn how to improve my ability to network.
- BEING PART OF A TEAM: Rotary taught me how to work better in teams, and to respect the structure and strength of a well-organized, diversified team.
- HOW TO BUDGET: From the exercise of setting up a club budget to setting up a budget for an event. Being able to learn from other Rotary members about what works and what to look out for.
- EVENT PLANNING: How to use big picture thinking in contrast to small logistical details and the skill of managing both to have an impactful event.
- JOINING A BOARD: Not only how to represent your club on a board but also how to run a board. How to make sure each part of our club or district has the type of attention it needs and consistently keeping track of everyone's needs.
- ORGANIZING A MEETING: How to run an effective, inclusive meeting and what's more, how to run a virtual meeting.
   Allowing for some fellowship but keeping laser focused on the goals at hand. Also, intentionally setting out to provide equity so we can create an environment for diversity to thrive.
- THE ART OF COMPROMISE: It is not often that a team agrees on everything. Rotary provides a safe space to have some authentic conversations and find those ways to compromise.
- BEING INTENTIONALLY DIVERSE: This is a decision. Having diversity in our teams and making sure you also keep everyone's
  needs in mind whether that be closed captions on a zoom, being culturally conscious with things like language, religion
  and even tradition vs best practices, or providing certain foods for diet and allergy requirements to considering
  accessibility of venues, etc.

- HOW TO PRIORITIZE: We as Rotarians have many ideas and much to do to transition ideas to reality. Prioritization is something Rotary has taught me over and over again.
- PUBLIC SPEAKING: This is not everyone's forte but there are many opportunities and many Rotary trainings in the learning center to help you grow this skill.
- CONFLICT RESOLUTION: This may not be everyone's favorite thing to do but is a seemingly necessary skill in today's world. Again, we have many trainings available to us in the learning center and every so often we find a need to use this skill in our lives inside and outside of Rotary.

All of these skills are skills I have acquired from my time in Rotary. Marshall & Sterling has supported my involvement with Rotary from the beginning as many influential people within our firm are also Rotarians. I know Marshall & Sterling has benefitted greatly in my growing capabilities taken from Rotary to be a better employee. I have improved my public speaking and presentation skills and now feel comfortable presenting to large, as well as small, groups. I have also grown in my abilities to run effective meetings and to organize events and agendas. I have a much better understanding of topics like DEI. In appealing enough times to our HR Director that we started a women's resource network (an affinity group internally to help employees grow professionally) and now have a chief diversity officer (both may not have been all a result of me but it certainly helped!)

I guess what I am attempting to say is Rotary has made me a better human all the way around. I know as I write this, that all of this is really only because I said YES to Rotary. I attended trainings, social events and club meetings everywhere I went. I got involved with local and international projects, learned about all of the good our foundation does and what it takes to administer all of that. I got involved in some zone and International RI events witnessing the extent of our reach.

There are many of you that may be reading this that have embraced all of Rotary and the incredible transformative abilities this organization can have on every portion of your life. However, if you read this and decide you are open to learning more than I would be rather excited to talk to you!

In May, our district is putting together a learning about leadership meeting. This is a social event to hear from some others on different roles and the benefits and training that the roles have brought them. It was this type of meeting that many years ago opened the door for me and I hope you might consider joining us.

Additionally, we have all of these other learning sessions for you to take advantage of!

- President Elect Training (PETS) is open to all, and each club has to pay for someone to go. If your club president elect is
  not attending, it could be you! This is a gathering of many NYS clubs with structured learning sessions and speakers from
  all over the world talking about what Rotary is doing or has to offer you. This is a great place to make powerful connections
  and to get inspired.
- We also have District Training Assembly (DTA) coming up on April 6th from 10am- 4pm at Vernon Verona Sherril High School. Admission is free. This is another great time to learn and to network. Covering many topics including: General sessions covering the key Rotary topics of Foundation, Membership, Public Image & Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. There will be break-out sessions with training for your club secretaries and treasurers, as well as opportunities to learn more about Rotary's Action Plan, Youth Programs, and becoming a leader in our region. Also, there will be a trade show space filled with booths featuring all of the CNY Rotary committees and programs where you can connect with leaders, ask questions and address you and your club's specific needs.
- The District Conference will be at the Binghamton Doubletree April 26-28. Please find the registration on our District website: we will have speakers flying in from different parts of the world, breakout sessions covering a variety of Rotary topics and lots of fun courses too like home brewing and Mandala painting! We will also have a talent show and an "Inauguration" of our first CNY President and board.
- Grants Management Seminar Our next CNY Rotary Grants Management Seminar will be held virtually on Monday, April
  1, 2024, at 7:00 pm. Additionally CNY Rotary is offering a live Grants Management Seminar at the District Assembly at VVS
  High School on Saturday, April 6, 2024.

You will also find many other ways to expand your Rotary experience through programs like RLI- Rotary Leadership Institute, RYLA-Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, our Zone Training- Learning to Lead and many other social events throughout the year.
